Secretary's Comments

Membership Drive

We have had a fairly successful membership drive this year with over 200 households joining the association and making donations for the fireworks and the buoy fund. There has just been a second mailing of the dues invoice and donations letter as a help-ful reminder to those you have not made a commitment to the lake activities. Re-minder, the fireworks will be funded though this solicitation for donations and we will no longer be doing a raffle.

Fireworks

As much fun as the fireworks raffle has been in the past, and as good fund raising project as it was, it is a very time consuming project for the leader and the many fine folks who helped sell tickets. This year we did not have anyone come forward to chair and or coordinate the raffle so it did not happen. If someone wants to chair this committee and take on this endeavor, please contact one of the Board members and we will help you get set for the next year.

Here is an explanation of what the funding stream for the fireworks is now. We are going to take the money raised through the raffle last year, the donation coin boxes, and donations received thought the annual membership and donations drive to ensure that the fireworks in 2012 will be equal to what we had last year. Any money raised above the amount needed to match last year's fine display, will be held as seed money for next year's fireworks. By doing it this way, we should always have a minimal base amount to ensure some type of fireworks display in subsequent years.

Volunteers

We as Board Members are volunteers. We do not get paid for our time and efforts and we have full time jobs and or other obligations besides the PLA. For this reason when no one comes forward to chair and or assist with various projects, we do not have a choice but to no longer hold these events. Thoughts for Appealing Your Tax Assessment

Plan ahead by speaking with your local assessor.

If you feel your value is too high, verify your reasons, gather facts and then pursue a correction.

Compare your records and thoughts with the assessor's and look for differences. For example, discrepancies in the square footage, or in the number of rooms or any other item affecting value should be explained.

Speak with the assessor about facts that you think are either erroneous, missing or should be considered.

Most assessors will automatically correct errors of fact when they are discovered and you will not have to appear before the board of review.

If you must appear before the board of review, you will have to present facts and show what you believe your property's value should be.

Documentation includes:

★ examining sales the assessor may offer as evidence of the value of your property.

✤ Finding recent sales of properties comparable to yours

✦ Make a comparison of average selling prices per square foot for properties that have been used by either you or the assessor.

← Examine comparable properties for obvious differences between them and your property: look at age, lot size, condition, number of bedrooms and bathrooms, pools, garages etc. In the case of Lakefront property also consider frontage dimensions

Boating Safety

The following information was provided to us from Sgt. Julie Jones of the Barry County Sheriff's Department Marine Patrol. She responded to an article that was posted on the Pine Lake Facebook page that talked about recent laws signed by Governor Snyder. The article alluded to no longer having safety inspections or being stopped for "life jacket count" along with other changes on access to the water from roads and access points. We thank Sgt. Jones for her comments and Sheriff Leaf for supporting the Marine Patrol.

Thank you for your inquiry. The article you have referenced is written as a brief overview with partial information and implies law enforcement officer have less authority to make boat stops. Not exactly accurate. After talking with the Captain and DNR, I believe the wording changed but the authority of the Marine Officer is the same.

Laws are often written with burdensome language and some difficult to interpret. (Reference House Bill 5110, Public Act 451, Section 80166 and 80166a.)Your attached article states, "Another new measure takes away officers' ability to stop boaters and make sure they have adequate floatation devices. The governor's office said, "Stops without reasonable suspicion of violation are an unnecessary hindrance for boaters." I am not certain what the governor's office actually said but the new law has simply removed the words which once said, "Except for the inspection of a vessel to determine the number and adequacy of personal floatation devices on a vessel"... then says, "A peace officer shall not



stop and inspect a vessel bearing the decal described in section 80166a... (those vessels bearing the safety inspection stickers.)

...without reasonable suspicion. (nutshell version) Law enforcement officers are not prevented from stopping a vessel and checking for personal floatation devices, it simply provides a guideline for law enforcement by requiring them to have reasonable suspicion for the stop of vessels displaying a Vessel Safety Inspection Sticker. Organizations such as the Power Squadron and USCG Auxiliary, will conduct extensive safety inspections and issue stickers to those who pass. If the sticker is displayed, an officer must have reasonable suspicion to stop the vessel. We encourage the stringent inspection of vessels and testing of boat owners seeking the sticker. The inspection requirements can be found at www.safetyseal.net The process takes effort and usually indicates a person is serious about safety. They are also tested on their knowledge of the marine laws. It is a good thing.

How will this affect boaters in Barry County? Not much. If an officer has reasonable suspicion that a vessel does not have sufficient Personal Floatation Devices, they can be stopped. The law also states that the personal floatation devices must be readily accessible. A vessel can be stopped by a Law Enforcement officer for any Marine or Criminal law violation. In procedural law reasonable suspicion is more than a hunch and less than "probable cause." Furthermore, all of this does not apply to those vessels who do not have a safety inspection sticker. People who go through the trouble of seeking this sticker are not usually the people that are operating in an unsafe manner however having a sticker does not prevent a vessel from being stopped. http://www.legislature.mi.gov/documents/2011-2012/publicact/ htm/2012-PA-0062.htm

In addition, the inland lake law SB778 referencing the docking or mooring vessels at a public road end. The key will be to note the definition of "public road" and "public road end". There are places in Barry County where this will affect a few people but most likely only in places where no current township ordinances presently exist addressing the problem. Also House Bill 4848, requires vessels to stop when signaled by a police officer to do so. The officer must be in uniform and in a marked vehicle or vessel. The operator must stop or will be subject to Flee and Elude charges which are a felony with varying degrees of punishment depending on prior convictions. http://www.legislature.mi.gov/documents/2011-2012/publicact/ htm/2012-PA-0060.htm

Finally, the PWC laws on age restrictions now reads... "(4) Beginning October 1, 2011, a person under the age of 16 shall not operate a personal watercraft on the waters of this state unless the person is not less than 14 years of age and 1 of the following circumstances applies:

(a) The person is riding the personal watercraft with his or her parent or guardian or an individual 21 years of age or older designated by the parent or guardian.

(b) The person is operating or riding a personal watercraft at a distance of not more than 100 feet from his or her parent or guardian or an individual 21 years of age or older designated by the parent or guardian.

... now if anyone has a question about the "100 foot law" regarding the 14 or 15 year old' required operating distance of the PWC from the parent... I have yet to find an answer for that. It seems to me that a 14/15 year old, that is in compliance with all other requirements, may still be in violation of the 100 foot law if that 14/15

year old travels at a speed greater than slow no wake while the parent is sitting on a dock or in an anchored vessel since it is a violation of the 100 foot rule to do so. Perhaps the best course of action would be to have the parent on the PWC with the 14/15 year old if they are operating at a speed greater than slow no wake. There is no change in the law requiring a PWC operator, born after December 31, 1978, to have taken a boater safety course and have the boater safety card on board while operating a PWC.

I am concerned about the translation of all of this information for the news letter. Like the article that was written in "Lansing", it is too easy to confuse the meaning of the law where it may not properly understood. It is always best to copy the law or the link to the laws so that we are not liable for a misinterpretation. If you have any further questions, please feel free to contact me. Thank you again for being an avenue for communication. Captain Johnson and I are available for meetings if the questions from the community are too difficult to safely answer in a news letter. We will also provide Boater Safety Courses free of charge to any group who wants to find a classroom setting. We like to have at least 20 people. Take care,



We have also had many suggestions of which are greatly appreciated. That being said, we still do not have very much participation in meeting attendance. Our hope and desire is to see Pine Lake and it's residents come together as a large community that offers a multitude of activites that can be enjoyed by all. This however, requires volunteers. As many have noticed, there is not a fireworks raffle this year, as we do not have the man power to organize and run it. Notes from the Prairieville Township Fire Department

Those of you that are fire buffs or listen to scanners may have noticed that the fire department is now going by the call name of the Prairieville Township Fire Department. What does that mean for us on the lake or in the township....nothing. The fire department will still respond to fires, medical emergencies and rescues as we have always done.

With the donation from the Pine Lake Association, and a matching amount of money from the Township we were able to purchase an MSA Thermal imaging Camera. This device is used to search for victims in limited site areas, such as smoke filled rooms or areas with no available lighting.

The Thermal Imaging Camera also has the ability to see behind walls and or in blind areas to determine the level of heat that is either trapped or is being generated. This gives us the ability to search out fire and extinguish it in hidden areas. It also allows us to determine that there is no fire in certain areas without having to tear apart walls or ceiling. We hope that by using this equipment we can minimize damage done by fire or by firefighters while fighting the fire

The first time the camera was used in the township, it was used on Enzian Rd. to determine that there was no extension of fire into an attic after a chimney caught on fire. Without this equipment the fire department would have pulled down walls and ceiling to check for extended fire.

Again Thanks so much for enabling us to buy this equipment.




